I don't know about you, but for me, Spring cannot get

here soon enough! April showers bring May flowers – kiss winter good bye.

As many of you will be aware the dynamics of the Village Council has changed with Brent Hartman stepping down as a Councillor at the end of January. Brent decided that 2014 was his retirement year and with regret his resignation was accepted. On behalf of the Village of Kenaston, Councillors and residents, I wish to thank Brent for his many years of dedicated public service. You will be missed.

With Brent's departure, a bi-election was necessary. By acclamation Dean Blenkinsop stepped into the position and attended his first meeting in February, 2014. Dean comes with municipal experience having held the positions of both Councillor and then Mayor of Hawarden. A big welcome and thank you to Dean.

Koodoes to our Village Foreman, Joe Stacowich and his crew, for the marvelous job they did with snow removal this winter. A snow removal policy was incorporated in the fall and, with the exception of a few minor glitches, appeared to work well. To assist with icy roads next winter the Village has purchased a sand/salt spreader – but let's forget about winter for now.

Spring is a time of renewal and growth and your Council is feeling the energy. The budget process has begun and high on the list of 'Must Do's' is the acquisition of a new town truck. Councillors Mills and Tomlenovich have the lead on this committee. A new village truck is very close to a reality.

I am sure you are all aware of the severe infrastructure deficit being experienced not only in Saskatchewan but all of Canada and beyond. Unfortunately, Kenaston is also feeling growing pains and infrastructure issues. Key to growth is planning – a strategy for facing the future. Knowing what is necessary infrastructure wise and the cost thereof. Incorporate into that lot development that may not be necessary this year, but it is coming. We need to budget for those costs, grow our reserves as best we can, and steadily move forward. If nothing else, sustain what we have.

One of the budget items to date, and although not officially approved it is a 'Must Do' on Council's list are the Village's curb stop valves leading to individual residences. It has been brought

to our attention that we are unable to turn off many of these valves as they are so corroded the fear is they will break if touched. It is just as important to be able to turn the water off as it is to turn it on. If you have a water issue and need the water turned off and we are unable to do it – well, not so good.

One of the big issues facing the Village has been the intersection of the #15 and #11 highways. After years of waiting, although not approved as yet by the Minister of Highways, Kenaston Council was made privy to the recommendation being made. April 1 a representative from the Ministry, the primary consultant, Village Council, Gene Whitehead as the EMO Co-ordinator, Ken Remmen our Deputy Fire Chief and James Simonson our Community Planner from WaterWolf, met to discuss Village concerns over the proposed plan. The only news I have to report is they heard our concerns and are back to the drawing board and going over a revised plan.
