Mayor: There is a second call for nominations for the position of mayor. Nomination forms can be picked up at the Village Office. Nominations must be returned to Village Office by 4 pm on October 3, 2012.

- Loraas bins are for village taxpayers to rent. The bin beside the water treatment plant costs \$5.00 per use and the one at the dump site costs \$10.00 per use. Both require the key from Village Office.
- ALERT: according to the Ministry of Environment any wood taken out to the dump is not allowed to have paint on it. Painted wood left at the site may result in closure of nuisance ground.
- A building and demolition permit is now required as council has passed a building bylaw. All development or demolition (excluding decks) requires a permit for a minimum fee of \$20.00.
