Kenaston Korner by ML Whittles:

Our future is upon us and your council has been busy ensuring it has a smooth landing.



A couple of weeks ago a meeting was held at Kenaston Place with Village Council, R.M. Of McCraney Council, the Deputy Fire Chief Ken Remmen, Ron Gerbrandt (Assistant Deputy Minister (ADM), Design and Innovation), Rock Gorlick (Executive Director, Central Region), Jennifer Fertuck (Acting Director, Regional Asset Management, Central Region) and Harold Retlzaff (P. Eng, Director, Transportation Planning) all from the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure. We met to discuss the #15 and #11 intersection and our issues with the proposed plan and to ensure we were heard.

Within minutes into the meeting, the A.D.M acknowledged that our concerns were valid. The redesign of the intersection is not going to take place anytime soon and when it does, we will be working with the steering committee. Quoting Jennifer Feruck: 'for the time being, Highway 15 will remain where it is today and receive regular maintenance to ensure serviceability.'

The A.D.M. was presented with the 169 signatures collected on a Petition placed at various businesses in the community. Your show of support was acknowledged by the A.D.M on behalf of the Ministry. On behalf of Council, I wish to thank you. We all took part in our future.

Besides infrastructure issues, the availability of lots has been a top priority. As the highway will be taking a different tack eventu-

ally, the Ministry was asked to consider exempting us from their distance regulation and allow us to sell and develop the empty lots along the #15. As of the date of writing this article, from discussions with the Ministry we should be hearing from them on that issue in the near future. It is sounding positive, but one never knows. Once we hear, I just know word will get out.

DG Mercer Eco Research was part of a second group who have developed ready lots in Davidson. This company has approached us and will be attending the next Council meeting for an exploratory discussion. A little expert help sure couldn't hurt, now could it?

Our Town Foreman, Joe Stacowich, remains on light duty but is back looking after the water treatment plant. Sheldon Modien, one of the new teachers at the D.E.C., will be also working for the village picking up the slack together with our summer student, Bryce Mills. Welcome Back and Bryce -Welcome Sheldon.
